Reception

This week Zibbo has got up to all sorts of mischief. He snuck into Mrs Fairhurst's bag at the weekend and played hide and seek in Mrs Fairhurst house. Luckily Mrs Fairhurst took pictures of his hiding places and we had to read some speech bubbles that he had left for us. The children's favourite place Zibbo hid was in the bin.

The children then had to write their own sentences in a speech bubble for Zibbo and we had to remember our finger spaces and full stops.

The children have been preparing a special feast for a party in the playdough we used sprinkles to make our cakes even more delicious, our classroom smelt delightful. In the construction area we have been designing a way for Zibbo to travel. The children came up with their own ideas and they built boats, cars and scooters for Zibbo.

In the creative area we have continued to develop our dragons and talked about our new word scaly. We used bubble wrap to make scaly skin for our dragons. Also in our creative area this week we have been completing the most beautiful observational drawings of sunflowers after some of our friends brought them in for us to look at.

In our investigation station we have been placing a vote for the question 'are dragons real?' We have been exploring photographs and deciding whether the creature could be a dragon or not.

In Maths we have focused our learning on recognising numbers to 5 and beyond and counting out special dragon eggs to match to the numbers. We have also been reasoning with numbers by looking more closely at that number and spotting other numbers inside.

Key Stage 1 News

Year 1

This week Year 1 have continued to learn all about friendship and love in our PSHE lessons. We gave lots of examples about how to treat people and discussed how we want to be treated. We also discussed healthy and unhealthy snacks and commented on some foods that would help us concentrate in class and some foods that may make us feel a bit giddy!

In Maths, we continued to count in ones and tens whilst learning how to count in fives. We consolidated our knowledge of finding more and less and began discussing how we can compare different objects. We used words such as more than, less than, fewer than and greater than. Later on in the week we started to look at numbers lines and commented on how each numberline starts with 0. We completed missing number problems using number lines too!

In Writing, we talked about our senses and when we use our senses throughout the day. We listed 5 things we can see, hear, taste, touch and smell.

In RE, we talked about what RE is and what religions there are. We were introduced to Christianity and talked about how Christians call God, the father. We listed what Christians may do to show their love for God and drew some beautiful pictures involving people giving to charity, praying and people going to church.

In Geography we looked at some more aerial maps and began to construct our own map of our school! We really enjoyed this!

In Computing we looked at what a laptop looks like and started to talk about its features. We labelled parts of a laptop and we are looking forward to using the laptops next week.

Year 2

In maths this week, we have looked at identifying numbers on a marked number line. Although a tricky concept for them, we worked so hard to learn vocabulary like 'intervals' to help us deduce numbers where arrows were pointing.

We finished our next shared reading story and completed our end of unit quiz which the children worked hard at finding the answers together.

On Wednesday the children took part in their forest school day with Mr Cooney where they did autumnal scavenger hunts and created hedgehog houses. All children had a blast!

In science, we looked at properties of different materials and how we could describe them. We came up with a good bank of vocabulary like 'hard, durable, flexible, stiff, rough, smooth and shiny', to describe certain things.

In spelling we have started to look at different rules. The ones we have looked at so far is having the -ck sound that follows a single vowel e.g. sock, sick, clip. We have also looked at doubling up on a letter following a single vowel e.g. glass, class, miss.

In RHE, we looked at working together as a team to make sure we can make each other happy in school We discussed different scenarios that can occasionally occur on the playground and we disucssed whether it would be something the children should try and solve on their own, or whether they would need help from an adult. This lesson was great in trying to help grow the children's independence.

Key Stage 2 News

Year 3

Our maths learning this week has focused on partitioning and labelling number lines. We know we count the intervals on a number line to help us work out what the number line is counting up in. We also used our understanding of place value to order 3-digit numbers.

In English we have carried on reading 'The Iron Man', discovering that the Iron Man escaped his trap and the mayor needs help making a new one! We designed our own traps for the Iron Man, thinking carefully about how we are going to lure, trap and secure the Iron Man. In our reading lessons we have been enjoying reading poetry this week, finding clues in a variety of poems to help us work out the hidden meanings behind the poems.

In RE we discussed why Christians choose to serve God. We looked at different prominent Christians and focused on the Salvation Army, looking at the activities they do to support others and spread God's word.

In Science we identified the properties of different igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary rocks, discussing why different rocks are chosen for different purposes.

In geography we carried on our learning about the UK by using the atlas to locate key British cities and labelling them on our own maps.

On Friday we celebrated world mental health day by thinking about how we could spread kindness. We thought of all the ways we bring light to each other's lives, before jotting down kind words about our friends to show all the ways we appreciate them.

Year 4

This week, in English, we have planned our paragraphs for our setting description narrative. We have then written our final pieces and worked hard at editing our work ourselves.

In Maths, we have been been counting in 25s, 50s and 500s and looking at recognising the patterns these create. This then came in very handy for our next step of blank numbers lines. We thought about finding in the midpoint and what value this would have on a number line from 0 to 1000 and 0 to 10000. We then thought about the quarter and three quarter points and our knowledge of 25s to help us to work them out.

In RE, we have been looking at our overarching question How should we live our lives? Which we will apply to all the religions we will be looking at. We have begun by looking Hindu dharma and 'What might a Hindu learn from celebrating Diwali?". We discussed about how in books and films we see good overcoming evil and we though about the different examples of this. We then thought about if good always wins and where we have seen personally good in the world. We then moved on to learning the story of Rama and Sita and why this story is important to Hindus.

In reading, we have learnt about common octopuses and how they similar and different to sea dragons.

Mrs Shone

Year 5

This week in Year 5, we have been looking at Roman numerals. We interpreted Roman numerals into numbers and also turned numbers into Roman numerals. We found it was like cracking a code and needed to spot tricky numbers like 4 and 9 which switch numerals round e.g. IV and IX.

In writing, we have been using modal verbs to show the certainty of something to happen e.g. Miss Ratcliffe will go to the shop vs Miss Ratcliffe might go to the shop. We also looked at the difference between facts and opinions and sorted statements into the correct categories.

For our geography topic, we looked at the 5 imaginary lines of the World: the equator, Tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic Circle and Antarctic Circle. We labelled these onto a World map.

In Spanish, we have been learning about emotions and wrote sentences about how we were feeling. We also moved onto looking at school subjects and learnt how to say key subjects in our curriculum.

Friday marked World Mental Health Day! We looked at a poem all about how special it feels to think about all of the people that are impacted by our kindness. We then created kindness tokens for someone close to us, to help brighten their day!

Miss Ratcliffe

Year 6

Warrington Council's Community Safety Team delivered a 'Would You Risk It?' workshop to Year 6 this week - 'Would You Risk It?' is a highly successful program delivered by youth workers and community safety and a police officers, focusing on the risks and challenges your year 6 pupils will face as they begin to transition into High School.

In Science, the children learnt about the evolution of finches at the Galapagos – learning more deeply about natural selection, the children looked at how the finches adapted and evolved different characteristics based on what type of environment they were exposed to – this linked with last week's experiment.

They then went on to look the completely different and contrasting biome of the Atacama Desert in Chile to emphasise the point the South America has many biomes, is diverse and is extremely vast. They examined how animals and plants at the Atacama have characteristics that help them be successful in their environment.

In Geography and Computing, the children began to focus more closely on Brazil, understanding how vast and diverse it is. The children analysed and manipulated climate data from a range of cities across Brazil, which highlighted how climate is significantly varied across the country and how Brazil is made up of multiple biomes. The children created combo line and bar graphs which illustrated just how diverse the country is.

Further in Computing, the children investigated spreadsheets, where they looked closely at the elements that make up a spreadaheet and how to collect and format data.

In Maths, the children carried out BIDMAS problems and revised finding percentages of number using the percentage decimal equivalents, as well as carrying out further practise of applying the four operations of fractions.

For Mental Health Awareness Day, the children began to look at what makes them happy, how they can make others happy and how they can set themselves goals for the future.
