Nursery

We have introduced our new book this week 'Jungle Jamboree' and the children have loved creating their own actions to the story so that we can retell it together.

We have been learning about more animals including zebra's, lions, hippopotamus's and leopards and the children have loved looking closely at the patterns on different safari animals. We have also been writing our own invitations to our very own Jungle Jamboree in class next week.

We have been matching animals to their correct animal print, painting animals, creating 3D manes for lions and making playdough stripes and spots for zebra's and leopards.

In maths the children have been repeating patterns with two colours using coloured bears, cotton reels and fingerprints and the children have also creating their own patterns for each other to continue.

Reception

This week we have been learning all about spring. We have been using spring flowers to complete observational drawings and we have been talking about blossom trees. Key Stage 1 News

Year 1

This week in Maths Year 1 have explored number bonds to 10 and to 20 to help them to identify related subtraction facts. We used numicon, number cards and part whole models to help us with this. We continued to use this knowledge to find missing numbers in different addition and subtraction calculations. Later on in the week we used numbers lines to help us to find missing numbers and learnt how to solve subtraction problems by counting backwards. Next week we will be looking at fact families.

In Writing, we completed our long write retelling the story 'Lost in the Toy Museum'. The whole class were amazed at how much they had written! We ensured that we included adjectives and conjunctions to make our writing more exciting. We then looked at how to add the suffix 'est' to root words and used these words in sentences.

In Geography, we enjoyed taking part in some field work. We used google maps to look at our local area and identified different symbols that are used on an aerial map. We created our own map and a key to show what our local area looks like around Bruche Primary

School. We were confident enough to complete our own aerial maps of where we all live too.

In PSHE we completed the next module of My Happy Mind. We focused on the word relate and discussed how we can relate to different people in our lives. We used our character strengths to pin point kindness in different scenarios.

In History we created our own generation map discussing who is in our family. We discussed what a timeline is and began to talk about how shops have changed overtime.

On Friday it was red nose day and we all came to school dressed in red! We took part in lots of games and activities to help raise money. We all really enjoyed the day!

Year 2

Key Stage 2 News

Year 3

In English this week, we have practiced using a dictionary to find definitions of words. We recapped how to find the words we were looking for alphabetically and to be careful in choosing the correct definition.

In maths we have continued focusing on our times tables. We have recapped the relationship between the 2's, 4's and 8's and have started to look at the 3 times tables. We have investigated the patterns in the 3's and have practiced reciting it.

In history we spoke about how trade happened during the Bronze Age, and looked at the kind of things people would have exchanged for goods. The children then had a go at having their own market stall with different goods and exchanged items for things they desperately needed.

The children also completed some comprehension questions on the first 3 chapters of Charlotte's Web, practicing how to write answers into a full sentence. They also then used their summary skills to summarise the first 4 chapters of the story, making sure they only used one sentence to describe.

Year 4

This week, in English we have been looking at using possessive apostrophes and have been thinking about where we should use them and why we have chosen the place as to whether they are singular or plural nouns. We then used illustrations of the witch to collect nouns and phrases about her appearance and used these to create similes and metaphors about the witch. WE ended the week by receiving a letter from the witch who has stolen the happy endings in the story and will only return them if we write some twisted fairy tales that have unhappy endings.

In Maths, we have dividing by 10 and 100 and then using this knowledge with our multiplication knowledge to scale known facts up and down.

In Geography, we have been learning about how mountains are formed. We have looked at the structure of the earth and learnt about its different layers. We then extended out scale knowledge from the previous week and used a toilet role of 1 sheet to 100 kms to make a scale of the top of the crust to the inner core. We then looked at tectonic plates and how the different kinds of mountains are formed.

In Science, we have been looking at states of matter and have been first learning what the 3 states are. We learnt how the particles are arranged and how they behave depending on the state and we went outside and had a go at behaving as the particles in different states.

On Thursday, we had a very interesting visitor from the local Iman of the Islamic faith who told us lots about being Muslim, about their beliefs, festivals and pillars. The children really enjoyed it and all found it very interesting.

Year 5

This week's maths focus has been fractions. We've explored equivalent fractions, learned to compare and order fractions with the same denominators and tackled comparing and ordering fractions with different denominators — a big challenge, but you all did brilliantly!

In writing, we created an ingredient list for the "Perfect Football Match". We had to remember all of the equipment that you would need to play football to ensure we didn't miss anything.

In Geography, we researched Central America and discovered fascinating facts about the countries, culture, and environment.

In History, we explored Maya gods and even found our Maya spirit animals using a fun website!

During RE, we learned about pilgrimages and reflected on why they are special to different faiths.

Miss Ratcliffe

Year 6

Year 6 have looked at the ways in which smoking and drinking alcohol can have a negative effect on the body, linking to all our work on the cardio-respiratory system and staying healthy.

In Whole Class Shared Reading, the children have been examining our class novel, “The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas” where they have been learning how to structure point, evidence, explanation answers. The children analysed how the author, John Boyne, tried to build a sense of danger by using evidence to clarify and then explaining how the evidence showed danger.

The also looked at the author’s viewpoint (what the author is trying to suggest) when explaining certain behaviours from the character of Father. The children then continued to practice constructing point/evidence/explanation answers.

In PE this week, children had opportunity to perfect their PAN dance and singing performance with Mrs Blackledge, whilst the rest of the children had an opportunity to play football with Mr Gould. Mrs Blackledge has again invited many of the children this Saturday morning to continue to get ready for the PAN Art festival next month.

In Maths, the children have worked on a variety of reasoning problems involving fractions, decimals and percentages. They have retrieved work on converting mixed numbers and improper fractions. They have also practised adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators.

In History, the children have looked at some authentic historical accounts of people’s experience of evacuation – they searched these accounts to find a mixture of good and bad experiences.
